Source	Cause	What to Do
Tools	<ol style="list-style-type: none">Sharpening<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Oil- Grease from stropCarving brush	<ol style="list-style-type: none">Wipe tools Wash and dry handsSynthetic. Lay upside down on bench Wash regularly
Hands	<ol style="list-style-type: none">Dirt from the benchSweat/moisturePencil Marks<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Use soft pencil; hard pencils indent	<ol style="list-style-type: none">Wipe bench occasionally with damp cloth VacuumCarving gloves (White, cotton) Wash regularlyEraser Clean with denatured alcohol or acetone
Air	Dust in the air (eg from grinder)	Vacuum Cover work when not carving
